- c) Paul Tinkle with WCMT Thunderbolt Radio attended the meeting to announce they will be playing the 1984 Greenfield Boys' State Championship game on the air Saturday, April 18th at 8:30 am. The 2018 Greenfield Girls' State Champion game in the future. They will also be streaming on their Facebook Chloe Moore-McNeil's signing with Indiana University on Wednesday, April 15th. d) Attorney Pemberton explained to the Board the highlights of the contract with Mobile PC Guys. The contract includes telephone, internet, e-mail, web hosting and all telecom to all City buildings. The cost will be right around \$1,000.00 per month. The prices are locked in for a year with possible automatic renewals. Recorder Smithson stated that is around what the City pays now for those services. This will also keep the services with a company in Greenfield. Installation cost will be \$4,954.60 because of all the new equipment and changing over to fiber. The new phones have been quoted at cost to be a “good neighbor.” Alderman MARK GALEY asked if everything can be set up by July 1st. Attorney Pemberton stated it depends on how quick contractors can install the equipment. Mobile PC Guys can start the work once the contract is approved and bill the City July 1st. Alderman THOMAS TANSIL, JR. asked if there would be any disruption in services during the switch. Attorney Pemberton suggested if the contract is approved for Mayor McAdams, Mobile PC Guys and department heads sit down to get at time table for the switch.
